The City of Brockville continues to take proactive steps and today, decided to close the following City facilities to the public as of 4pm until Sunday April 5, 2020.

- Brockville Arts Centre,
- Brockville Museum,
- Brockville Library,
- Brockville Youth Arena and the Brockville Memorial Centre.

In addition, the March 17 Finance and Administration Committee and the March 24 City Council meeting will be cancelled.

"These are extraordinary times and we will continue to work through this together. It is our priority to keep you informed as we make decisions." – *Mayor Jason Baker.*

City Hall will remain open and other services operational at this time.

The City of Brockville is reviewing the situation on a day to day basis while we take all necessary precautions towards the spread of COVID-19.

The Leeds, Grenville & Lanark District Health Unit, the lead agency in Brockville for [COVID-19](#), has reported there are no suspected or confirmed cases in Brockville.

We would like to take this opportunity to send our appreciation to all of the front-line staff, first responders and health care professionals who continue to show dedication in our community.
