- ✓ As of September 22, Ontario requires proof of vaccination to enter the premises.
- ✓ To enter, you are required to show proof that you are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and personal identification.
- ✓ Skaters must maintain 2 metre physical distancing from persons outside of their household.
- ✓ Masks must be worn inside the facility at all times except when actively engaged in skating.
- ✓ Participants should arrive no earlier than 15 minutes prior to start time and must exit the facility within 15 minutes of end time.
- ✓ Upon arrival, participants will be met by facility staff to complete COVID screening, provide contact tracing information, purchase their ticket, and will be assigned to a dressing room.
- ✓ Existing rules regarding public skating at the Brockville Memorial Centre still apply except where modified by the above procedures or by Provincial/Public Health orders.

Patrons are asked to obey the following rules to ensure a safe and pleasant skating experience

1. Patrons must respect, listen and follow instructions from the facility operator and/or skate patrol at all times. Please report all accidents or injuries to the on-site facility operator.
2. It is highly recommended that all skaters wear a CSA-approved helmet during all skating sessions.
3. Only persons wearing skates are permitted on the ice surface.
4. The middle of the ice surface is reserved for children and less confident skaters.
5. Skaters are asked to skate at a sensible and safe speed in the same direction as other skaters.
6. It is recommended that a parent or guardian supervise young children and inexperienced skaters at all times.
7. Strollers and skating aids are permitted ONLY during Parent / Tot sessions with the accompaniment of a responsible person on skates.
 - a) Wheels must be cleaned first for the safety of others.
 - b) Helmets are recommended for stroller occupants.
 - c) Stroller occupants are asked to utilize the perimeter of the ice closest to the boards as recommended by the Ontario Recreation Facilities Association.
8. Chairs are NOT PERMITTED on the ice for any reason.
9. The use of strollers and / or skate aids is NOT PERMITTED during public skating sessions.
10. Games, tag, rough-play or speed skating are deemed harmful and dangerous to others and are NOT PERMITTED.
11. Carrying children while on the ice surface is NOT PERMITTED at any time.
12. The use of headsets, cell phones or hand held electronic devices are NOT PERMITTED while skating.
13. Food and drinks are to be enjoyed in the lobby or stands and are NOT PERMITTED on the ice surface.
14. Foul language or inappropriate behavior will result in the immediate removal from the facility.
